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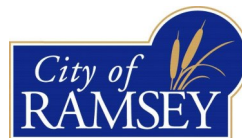

It's Safety Camp Time!

Every summer in the city of Ramsey, up to 144 kids eagerly line up on the first day of the two-day safety camp. They meet their counselors, change into their Safety Camp t-shirts, and greet their fellow campers.

From there campers and counselors congregate at their designated sites. Each camper is properly fitted with a new bike helmet and they learn how to do the alphabet shuffle.

The fun begins as the teams brainstorm ideas for their team names and come up with a song or chant that describes their group.



Safety Presentations

Every year we offer a variety of safety topics that address the most common unintentional injury areas for children (typically ten topics). The presentations are interactive and provide campers time to practice new skills. The topics change each year to give repeat campers the opportunity to learn more safety messages.

Poison Awareness. Poison Control teaches kids through lecture and interactive games which common household products are poisonous.

Bike Safety. Campers are properly fitted with a new bike helmet and test their skills on a challenging bike course.



Personal Safety. Learn how to trust your gut instinct in uncomfortable situations while learning who your safety friends in the community are.

Brain Injury Prevention. Experience what it would be like to have a brain injury and try to do normal everyday things.

Self Defense. A practical skills class which teaches children how to NOT become a victim of an attack or abduction.

Eddie Eagle Program. How to be safe around (found) guns.

Team/Confidence Building. Activities that promote teamwork and creative problem solving.

Animal Safety. How to be safe around domestic or wild animals you may encounter.

Hazard House. Identifies common injury areas in your home.

Internet Safety. Learn basic online safety that is age appropriate using the NetSmartz program.

First Aid Basics. First aid scenarios to get kids thinking about what they would do in an emergency.

Safe Escape House. How to safely navigate through your house in the event of a fire.

Burn Prevention. The HCMC Burn Unit presents an important message about not playing with fire.

Drug Demand Reduction Program. The National Guard lands their "Huey" and delivers an important anti-drug message.

Water Safety.

Basic water safety techniques and plenty of play time are provided at the pool. Instruction is also given on PFD's and reacting to boating/water emergencies.
